

Community Development Initiatives: Training, Awareness Programs, and Strategic Evaluation



On 5th June, 2024, an awareness program on dry ration was conducted at Bollonggre B IVCS Ltd. in SWGH District. At Bollonggre B IVCS Ltd., the secretary and chairman briefed members on the concept of dry ration and discussed a list of items tailored to their requirements. Similarly, on June 4th, 2024, an awareness program on dry ration was also held at Kuligre IVCS Ltd., where similar discussions and briefings took place, aiming to educate members about the importance and practicalities of dry ration.



On 5th June, 2024, the District Project Management Unit (DPMU), Khliehriat organized a training session on producer group bookkeeping for group facilitators, FOCUS volunteers, and NGOs. The event took place at the Tista Conference Hall in Khliehriat.



On 8th June, 2024, a meeting convened with the Kremmyrsiang IVCS Management Committee, subcommittee, and members to evaluate the top 100 IVCS. Shri H. Blah, Senior Manager of SPMU, conducted an assessment and engaged in discussions with the members, offering strategic insights aimed at fostering sustainability and self-sufficiency within the IVCS framework.

On 10th June, 2024, a meeting was convened with the Nonglang IVCS Management Committee to evaluate the IVCS across various areas. This particular IVCS ranks among the top 100 performing IVCS. Shri Ivan Marbaniang, Senior Manager (Megha-LAMP), SPMU, Smt. Bronia Marak, Manager of Knowledge Management (Megha-LAMP), SPMU, and Smt. Infrastructure Development: Assessments, Site Identification, and Damage Inspection





On 6th June, 2024, a site identification was conducted in the presence of Smti. A. Khongjee, DPM, EKHD, and Smti. J. Ranee, A.M, BDU, along with the Executive Committee and MLAMP Committee of Lenpdengshnong, for the construction of a Protection Wall at Pamseiñiong, Lenpdengshnong village under Sohiong C & RD Block.



On 6th June, 2024, the DPMU team from Khliehriat conducted an inspection of the community nursery damaged due to the recent heavy rain at Tubershohshrieh village, EJHD.

Place of Visit: Songadinggre Farmers Market, Dadenggre Block.

Purpose of Visit: Site Survey for additional work at Songadinggre Farmers Market. The site has been identified and measured for the following:

Office cum Crèche area - 330 sqft.

Toilet - 620 sqft.

Storage - 280 sqft.

Slaughterhouse - 350 sqft.

The land area measurement was conducted by the Field Engineer (incharge of Dadenggre) in the presence of the President of the IVCS, Market Committee, IVCS incharge, and Market Associate. The proposed market area covers approximately 3 bighas and has been developed into three levels. Additionally, the site is located opposite the new Dadenggre Court.

Infrastructure Development: Assessments, Site Identification, and Damage Inspection







An inspection of the Farmers Market and Prime Hub construction at Jongksha and Jatah Nonglyer:

The inspection was attended by Shri B. Syiem, CE, PWD, Shri S. Lyngdoh, Senior Manager, SPMU, Smti A. Khongjee, DPM, East Khasi Hills, Shri B. Singhania, Contractor, Shri W. Nongbri, and Shri A. Kharlukhi. The outcome of the inspection revealed that the construction of the prime hub foundation needs to be redone according to the plan to reinforce trust for better strength. Additionally, it was noted that sealing of all the walls is necessary to prevent water seepage for the installation of shutters. Further actions include raising the floor bed to prevent waterlogging, ensuring proper construction of toilets with brick walls and a septic tank, implementing a proper drainage system around the structures, and constructing a waste disposal site efficiently.

Plantation Drives: Fostering Environmental Conservation and Tourism Development



On 5th May, 2024, a plantation drive was conducted at the Matchok Auram catchment area in Sarang Apal, in collaboration with Dambo Rongjeng C&RD Block, East Garo Hills. Locally available saplings such as Aritak, Jambu, Techri, and Gup were planted during the event, which saw the participation of 200 individuals, including staff and villagers. Adjacent to the plantation site lies a small lake slated for development by the Tourism Department, where plans are underway to construct tree houses, small bridges, and boats for tourists.

"Pit digging"







Pit digging is currently taking place in several locations, including the Thapa Dangre Community Reserve, and the villages of Sasatgre, Silsekgre, and Manggakgre within the Rongram block. Furthermore, pit digging activities have begun in Ravagre villages and Ading Nokat, also in Rongram. These efforts highlight extensive and ongoing pit digging activities across these regions.









The ongoing activities at Halfmoon Terrace include continued preparation at Ajasiram Community Reserve, along with the ongoing gap filling and preparation at Rongpetchi Community Reserve.

The Sampalgre VPIC, supported by the BPMU from Gambegre Block, hosted an inaugural plantation event with the SSA UP School to raise environmental awareness among school children on July 6th, 2024. The event aimed to highlight the importance of afforestation and natural resource management in combating climate change. The BPM and Project Associate educated the children on environmental preservation, emphasizing both individual and collective responsibility. Interactive sessions inspired the children to adopt sustainable practices and advocate for conservation. The event demonstrated the effectiveness of community-driven initiatives in fostering environmental stewardship and cultivating future eco-conscious leaders.





Reports from Tikrikilla BPM, FE, GIS & AM, PA detail visits to all Tikrikilla VPIC villages for springshed management activities, where they assessed five springs to identify critical ones. Comprehensive springshed management has been completed in all villages. Additionally, FE Kharkutta conducted spring mapping for the Jambal Cluster and critical spring mapping for Rangsa Village under the Kharkutta Block.

On the 5th and 6th June 2004, Umiew Catchment Management Unit organized two-day training on Community Nursery Management for all the Self-Help Groups (SHGs) involved in nursery activities within their respective villages. This training was held at the Vocational Training Centre (VTC) of the Veterinary Office in Upper Shillong. On the second day, participants visited the nursery at Sangmein in Upper Shillong to gain practical insights and hands-on experience.

The Umiew Catchment Management Unit visited Demthring Village in the Mylliem block on 6th June 2024 to raise awareness about their project. Demthring is one of the five pilot villages under the Umiew catchment area. During the visit, the Catchment Project Manager (CPM) and his team introduced the project, emphasizing its objectives and outlining the initial activities. These activities include forming the Village Project Implementation Committee (VPIC), conducting Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) exercises, and organizing Forest Protection Awareness (FPA) contests.







On June 11, 2024, the MegArise project, MGNREGA, IORA (Carbon credit), and PES -Ganol Catchment collaboratively organized a meeting cum awareness program on convergence at Bibagre village in the Rongram block. Following that, on June 12, 2024, a similar meeting cum awareness on convergence with line departments took place at Wadagre village, also under the Rongram Block.

The purpose of this meeting was to enhance the quality of life for the community living in the catchment areas by introducing various asheres through these projects. Additionally, it simed to effort them the community to transition from Thurn cultivation to elementing.



Green Field Associates (GFAs) are presently in the process of collecting application forms and utilization certificates, demonstrating their active involvement in gathering comprehensive information from applicants.


